Title (Times New Roman, 14 Font Size, Bold, Sentence Case, Centered)

Author's Surname, Initials¹, <u>Author's Surname, Initials²</u> (Times New Roman, 12 font size) (Corresponding author should be underlined)

Affiliation (Times New Roman, 10 font size, Italic) Email (Times New Roman, 10 font size, Italic)

Introduction (Times New Roman, 12 font size, bold, Sentence case)

The introduction should contain (1) the scope (2) research problem (3) objective/s of the study (4) a brief review of the pertinent literature.

Methodology

The methodology must be clearly stated and described in sufficient details. The author should explain the research question/s, describe the research framework, and the methods applied in brief. Furthermore, it should be highlighted how the research question/s relevant to theory and practice, and why the chosen method(s) are suited for the problem.

Findings

The findings and discussions should be elaborated in this section.

Conclusion

Conclusion should include (1) the principles and generalizations inferred from the results (2) theoretical and/or practical implications of the work (3) conclusions drawn and recommendations and (4) any exceptions, problems or limitations of the work,

References

References should be listed in the alphabetical order, and presented in a format according to the APA referencing style. The number of references should be limited to ten (10).
