The introduction section should present (1) the background (2) objective/s of the research (3) the problem, and (4) a brief review of the pertinent literature. *(Times New Roman, 11 Font Size).*

Methodology

The methodology must be clearly stated and described in sufficient detail or with sufficient references. The author shall describe the research framework, and the methods applied in detail.

Findings

The results should be presented and findings should be discussed in detail in this section.

Conclusion

Conclusion should include (1) the principles and generalizations inferred from the results, (2) any exceptions or limitations of the research, (3) theoretical and/or practical implications of the research, and (4) conclusions drawn and recommendations.

References

References should be listed in alphabetical order and presented in a format according to the APA referencing style. Number of references should be limited to **eight (08)**.
