#### Guidelines for the Abstract

Abstracts should be between 300 - 350 words long and provide a succinct summary of the article. Although the abstract should explain why the article might be interesting, the importance of the work should not be over-emphasized. Citations should not be used in the abstract. Abbreviations, if needed, should be spelt out. Abstracts should be structured as follows.

**Purpose:** This is where you explain 'why' you undertook this study. If you are presenting new or novel research, explain the problem that you have solved. If you are building upon previous research, briefly explain why you felt it was important to do so. This is your opportunity to let readers know why you chose to study this topic or problem and its relevance. Let them know what your key argument or main finding is.

**Study design/methodology/approach:** This is 'how' you did it. Let readers know exactly what you did to reach your results. For example, did you undertake interviews? What tools, methods, protocols or datasets did you use?

**Findings:** Here you can explain 'what' you found during your study, whether it answers the problem you set out to explore, and whether your hypothesis was confirmed. You need to be very clear and direct and give exact figures, rather than generalize. It's important not to exaggerate or create an expectation that your paper won't fulfil.

**Research limitations/implications:** Limitations of the research (if any) should be described here. The practical implications of the study should be emphasized.

**Originality/value:** This is your opportunity to make a clear and succinct case for the value of your results. It's a good idea to ask colleagues whether your analysis is balanced and fair and again, it's important not to exaggerate. You can also reflect on what future research steps could be.
